#### **Newsletter 15 November 2004**

Our walk along part of the John Muir Way and AGM in Dunbar in October were most successful, thanks to Colin Will, who provided expert geological guidance about its volcanic cliffs and raised beaches, and Lesley-May Miller, who arranged our lunch and meeting room. In the course of a very positive discussion at our AGM (see director's report and minutes) it was agreed:

# i) Members' Profiles

to invite all members to submit a short profile of themselves to Norman Bissell indicating how they had become interested in geopoetics and their particular areas of interest.

Our purpose is to circulate this information to members to encourage connections, ideas and discussion about geopoetic theory and practice e.g. in the visual arts, natural sciences, literature; about our field visits to Roslin, the Isle of May, Little Sparta and Dunbar; and responses to the four new Kenneth White books published in Scotland since last year. This will enable members who cannot attend talks and visits to participate more fully in our work.

#### ii) Election of Council
